


We have also been able to share our resources. As a not for profit organization it's particularly satisfying to be able to donate to some really great charity/nonprofits.

New Rider Clinic Class 3 Graduates

New Rider Clinics Dave Wittry, VP Education

We offer our New Rider Clinics in the Spring of each year. Once you have completed the entire session, you receive a one year free membership to the Louisville Bicycle Club and a jersey. The New Rider Clinics have concluded for 2021. Forty two students completed the five-class course and many of them have started to ride with the club. Though this is a relatively small number of graduates by historical standards, it is over three times more than last year's Covid-affected event. In all, 64 participants attended at least one class. We want to thank everyone who attended and the volunteers who continue to help make this program successful.
