John joined the Louisville Bicycle Club in May of 1990 and was chuckling not too long ago about how long it's taken him to achieve this goal. Doing the math though that's a pretty darn respectable average of about 3200 miles a year. On top of that he's had a few years thrown in that he concentrated more on tennis or running bumping up that average on the cycling seasons even more!

John was looking forward to another good riding season this year but on May 22nd while participating on a Mad Dog Century ride a dog had other plans for him. Riding on a peaceful stretch of road in Bullitt County an unleashed and

unfenced dog collided with John's front wheel and sent him to the pavement sustaining injuries requiring surgery and ending his season just 32 miles short of his 100,000 mile goal.

Or did it? Yes, the advice of the doctors was that there would be no bicycle riding this summer but the good news was that he would get plenty of exercise going to physical therapy. Oh what joy! But then just before the touring season was to end his friends from the LBC stepped in. On October 11th ,with his doctors consent of course, John saddled up on the back of Larry Preble's tandem and completed the Monday morning 35 mile ride putting him over the top with 3 miles to grow on for the next 100,000.





Word got out and over 50 of Johns friends wore their longest mileage award jerseys and joined him on the ride out to Iroquois Park. On hand to welcome him to the 100,000 dub were Jim Tretter, Paul Battle, Bernice McGill and Larry Preble.

## **TOUR DE MAD DOG (TMD)**

TMD stands for Tour de Mad Dog. The TMD Challenge consists of 21 stages, (95 to 120 miles each) spread out over the course of the touring year, from January through October - ending by the last day of the club touring season.

Modeled after the famed Tour de France, the Tour de Mad Dog is a Challenge, not a race. Your actual time on the courses will not even matter! Riders must

complete at least 10 stages of the tour to be considered an official TMD Challenge finisher.

#### For the 2022 series:

- There will be 21 stages
- Two Mad Dog Centuries each month from January through October
- ♦ There will be a time trial yet to be determined to get to the 21 total

If a rider completes 10 century rides, they earn a jersey. Cost – if any – to be determined. We need to secure a sponsor(s). Anyone can participate in the series, but only LBC club members are eligible for the jersey. To be eligible for the series and a jersey, you must have completed one of the centuries by the end of May. We hope to secure sponsors that will make the jersey free.

A male and female winner will be awarded at year end based on who completes the most TMD centuries in a group of five or more. A drawing will determine the winner if 2 or more folks tie for the most points – or if we hold a time trial, the best time will win.

The sign-in sheets at the completion of the rides will determine who completed each ride and who completed in a group of five ormore. The schedule is posted on the website and Ride Captains will be putting their rides on the Ride Calendar.

## **THE OKHT IS BACK FOR 2022**








