According to the LBC bylaws:

Notwithstanding the preparation of a slate of candidates, the presiding official at the Annual Meeting shall solicit any nominations from the floor.

In Loving Memory of Scott Allen Anderson 1969 - 2021

Remembering Scott Anderson

I know a lot of you have Scott stories. Stories about how fast he was. What a climber. What us cyclists would call a strong rider. My Scott story is about strength as well. I knew Scott for a long time going back to our days riding with the Spoke N Word at Southeast Christian Church. Probably 15-20 years ago. We never spent a lot of time together on the bike. Mostly

I would see him at the beginning of a ride and we'd chat casually. Then the ride would start and that was it. He would be long gone and by the time I made it back to the start he would've finished, packed up and gone home. We had a good relationship though. Although he could ride with the elite group he neveracted like he was elite and was generally friendly to everyone.

August 2018. I participated in the Tour de Mad Dog beginning in 2004 and completed the challenge most of those years. In 2018 I wasn't having as much fun with it as I had and decided I would ride the 100 mile series one more time and call it a day. The last ride I needed to complete the challenge that year was Larry Preble's River dance century ride out of the Buckner, KY YMCA. There was a large crowd that day. I saw and spoke briefly with Scott before we took off and figured that would be the last I saw of him for the day. But that was not to be. As I mentioned earlier it was August and was typically hot and humid. I was going to finish the ride but I was struggling that day.

By the time I was nearing Blakemore lane about 85 miles in I was a mess. And then I saw Scott approaching from behind. I must've passed up a store stop or maybe he had a flat or stopped to help someone who did. I don't know how, but I had gotten ahead of him. I figured he would just blow by me. Scott was known as a climber and Blakemore is a series of hills that was just the kind of road he loved to ride. Scott chose instead to ride in with me. Like I said earlier I would finish this ride but I was not having a lot of fun. Anyone who's ever been at that place in a ride knows how much it can help to have someone hang with you, pull you up the hills and just hang out and take your mind away from feeling sorry for yourself in your miserable state. Scott could have crushed those rollers on Blakemore and been at home watching TV by the time I made it back to Buckner but he chose to pull me in.

It was that day that I learned just how strong Scott really was. What he was truly made of. He probably never thought about it but I'll never forget the strength of character Scott showed me that day. We'll miss you my friend.



Touring Guideline Update:

VP Touring- Amelia Dauer

10/15/2021— This was added: Effective in 2022, any Executive Committee member may recuse themselves from any club competition at the beginning of the touring season.

Ride Captain Guideline Updates:

- **10/15/2021** The following was removed: Please add rides to the calendar at least two (2) days prior to the ride.
- **11/10/2021** The following was removed: At the Ride Captain's discretion, a ride start may be delayed up to two hours. The new start time must be announced to the assembled riders. If possible, the ride captain should be present at the start location at the original start time to no tify the arriving riders of the delay.
- **12/8/2021** The following was removed: Ride Captains whose rides have been canceled before the ride start, due to inclement weather or other safety considerations, will receive Ride Captain credit but not mileage credit, provided that the Ride Captain notifies the Club Statistician.

Hints and Tips—Google Calendar

- Would you like the LBC calendar to be one click away? Download the Google Calendar app to your phone and that will happen.
- Are you on the web site from your desktop and want to see the full screen? Scroll down the calendar then Click on the + next to Google Calendar.
- From the web site on your computer, would you like to see a week at a time, a month at a time, or a different view, click on Week, Month, or Agenda
- If the GPS link is not highlighted for you, click on "more details" where it will then be highlighted and accessible.

Hints and Tips—Club's RWGPS

- Clicking on this link makes you a club RWGPS member, allowing you to view the route library and download routes from the library. https://ridewithgps.com/auto_approve/Club/5393/DAfvxsiND74Llokh After clicking on the link, On your computer, go into the club's rwgps account. You can do this from your personal account by going to Jump To at the top right, scroll to the bottom and on the left you will see the red LBC logo. Click on that then Sign Into Club on the right. No password is needed. You know you are in the club account by the yellow bar across the top.
- To access RWGPS club routes on your phone, on the RWGPS App, click on the LBC icon, then Organization Routes, then Search for the route that is in the club library.
- If you are a current ride captain, you will be made a Route Manager, allowing you mapping capability.
 - o When mapping, do not click at intersections. Instead, click before or after intersections.
 - o Routes need to be in the club's RWGPS library to enable everyone access to the route.
 - o Name your routes with the start location and destination as this is a library of rides and we want everyone that likes your ride to be able to find it in the library.
 - o You can move your personal routes to the club library by getting onto the club RWGPS, Find the route, then Keywords to find your route, View the route, go to More, then Copy To My Routes.

2020 Mad Dog Series Rules

There will be 21 stages

There will be two Mad Dog Centuries each month from January through October

There will be a time trial – yet to be determined to get to the 21 total

If a rider completes 10 century rides, they earn a jersey. Cost – if any – to be determined. We need to secure a sponsor(s). Anyone can participate in the series, but only LBC club members are eligible for the jersey. To be eligible for the series and a jersey, you must have completed one of the centuries by the end of May. We hope to secure sponsors that will make the jersey free.

A male and female winner will be awarded at year end based on who completes the most TMD centuries in a group of five or more. A drawing will determine the winner if 2 or more folks tie for the most points —or if we hold a time trial, the best time will win

The sign-in sheets at the completion of the rides will determine who completed each ride and who completed in a group of five or more. Ride Captains will automatically earn a point for sweeping their ride, and not held to complete with 5 riders.

It will be the ride captain's call to cancel their ride. Rides will not be rescheduled. Dates must be approved in advance to avoid any club conflicts. If possible, a Ride Captain that cannot fulfill their role on the day they signed up for, should find a replacement Ride Captain. The stage should not be cancelled unless absolutely necessary. This does not apply due to weather related conditions. If a ride is cancelled due to weather, a replacement cannot be made. Official Communication to riders will be through the Ride Schedule or emails through the Director.

Anyone is welcome to ride. We simply suggest the rider be century fit meaning they should be capable of riding 100 miles at a reasonable pace (min. 13-15mph). If you haven't ridden 60 to 75 miles on your own, I would not suggest trying to do a Mad Dog century.

There is no vehicle support for these centuries. If you or someone with you cannot repair your bike, you will need to have a backup plan to get back to the starting point or home. Our ride captains typically ride in the rear of all participants and promote a safe ride but they are not responsible for getting you back to your car or home.

Our rides are typically in rural areas throughout Kentucky and Southern Indiana. The scenery is beautiful with low traffic roads chosen to ensure rider safety. We expect riders to obey traffic laws and exhibit good judgement to the cars and people they encounter on these rides.

The rides typically have 3 store stops every 25 miles with the second stop intended for lunch. Because of the pandemic, some stores may be closed without prior warning. Be prepared with ample food and drink to get you to a next stop.

The ride captain will provide cue sheets for the course and GPS routes via the club GPS library. Ride Captains are encouraged to put their rides on the calendar as soon as possible.

Ride Captains will preview their course prior to the ride and verify that parking is available and does not affect a business. It is highly encouraged to start in locations with restrooms available or at least nearby.

These rides typically attract 20 to 30 riders. We encourage riders to ride in a pack that fit the pace they prefer to ride. You will find packs that span various pace levels. Group riding, rather than individual speed, will be rewarded this year.

All riders will be required to sign-in at the beginning of the ride and also to sign-in at the end of the ride with your group. Ride Captains will leave the sign in sheet on the tire of their car for easy access for those completing the ride before the sweep. (or somewhere easily accessible and told to the group prior to starting the ride)
